
REACHING THE NATIONS


Even though 2020 was a hard year for everyone, we were encouraged to see God move in many ways. When the pandemic began, foreigners left the country in large numbers, making us two of very few foreigners still living in our city. Our friends and neighbors noticed this and began asking us why we stayed, which opened doors to deep spiritual conversations explaining that we try to exemplify God's love for us with everything we do, which for us included continuing to invest in our community even in the uncertainty of a pandemic.

We also graduated from our language learning team after reaching strong levels of Arabic and joined a new team in a new city. Our focus is church planting among Syrian communities through meeting physical and spiritual needs, so our weeks are filled with house visits and various aid initiatives, helping out with basic needs, education, and access to healthcare. We are able to both work as a team on already established initiatives and find new projects that are our own, working to expand our team's current outreach into our new neighborhood. Even though changing cities during a pandemic has not been the easiest path, we've already begun to build meaningful relationships with our neighbors, most of whom are Syrian refugees.

God has provided so much for us and our friends, and we have been blessed seeing Him answer prayers over this past year!

CELEBRATING GOD'S FAITHFULNESS

With deep thankfulness to our Lord and Savior, it is my joy to submit this update on behalf of the Final 58 mission to unengaged, unreached peoples in Southeast Asia. Just three years ago over 150 people groups in Laos had no church, most with no believers. Worse yet, they had no missionary, church, or evangelist working among them. These people groups were small tribes scattered here and there in deeply remote regions beyond rushing rivers, on high mountain peaks, and in hidden valleys. Through your prayers and generosity, over one hundred national missionaries have been specially trained and sent into these tribes. Pennington Park, you have invested heavily in this training process. Fifty-two new missionaries were trained in 2020 alone! Thank you! The last couple rounds of trainings have been particularly exciting, as many of the new missionaries are from the tribes we first engaged.

In the field, the missionaries have been faithful through persecutions and hardships. Not everyone has come through, but over 80 tribes have now begun to be engaged, including 35 new groups since January of 2020. The work is still young, but there are simple house churches among 13 tribes and another 30 tribes with a believing nucleus. Would you join us in believing that the Lord would raise up a church in every tribe we work among? Also, there are another 38 tribes who are still completely without a gospel witness. We believe the Lord would see every tribe and tongue worshiping the Lord. Please join with special prayer for every remaining tribe in Laos to be engaged within the next 18 months. The Lord can do it!

THE BEAUTY OF INTENTIONAL DISCIPLESHIP


Women's Discipleship Group

TRUSTING GOD IN UNKNOWN CIRCUMSTANCES

God's Faithfulness in 2020

2020, was no doubt a stressful year for everyone. Some more than others, but never have I been so thankful to know and love a Faithful God.

My husband and I had just opened our new CrossFit gym location in January of 2020. We had moved from Fishers to Noblesville for a brand-new gym facility with more space and hopes to grow our business. We were supposed to move into our new gym on January 1st. The new year is our busiest month, so we were counting on being open on New Years. The day we were moving our landlord told us that our space wasn't ready. They hadn't finished construction on time and it was going to be 3 weeks before we could open. We were discouraged, but it was out of our control so we just trusted God would provide while we waited to reopen.

Of course, we did re-open, and we had a great month and a half. Then everything got shut down because of the COVID pandemic. On March 17th we had to shut down our gym. We had no idea what we were going to do and we were totally unprepared. We lost a few gym memberships at first, which we figured would happen, but we thought we would be back open in a few weeks.

Then 4 weeks went by. We still were not open, so we prayed and asked God to direct us and give us wisdom on how to handle our clients memberships, their money, and the services we provided. We made it work and most of our members stuck around for a little while. Then the cancellations started rolling in.

Because we were in a new building under a new lease, we had 3 months of no rent. per our contract with our landlord. What a blessing our landlord gave us grace one more month and we weren't going to owe any rent until June 1st. That was the first blessing. But by May 1st, we had lost 60% of our memberships, and almost all of our revenue. We had to get on a call with our coaches and let them know that we weren't sure if we were going to make it another month.

Revenue was coming to a screeching halt and there wasn't a whole lot more we could do for our members who wanted to work out in our gym. We had enough to pay our rent on June 1st, but that was it. We didn't take a salary for 3 months and we couldn't file for unemployment, because we are self-employed.

Then God just started providing in ways we couldn't imagine. We were blessed by Pennington Park Church with financial help, multiple times, and then our small group gave to help us.

Everyone surrounded us with prayer, love, and support. My parents helped us, Bryan's parents helped us, and then God let the flood gates open. We finally were able to reopen May 22nd. I wasn't sure what was going to happen when we reopened, but God did.

We have been growing ever since May 22nd, we have tripled our revenue and our memberships and we've been able to hire full time employees. I can say now, that even though this past year was one of the most difficult, it was when I saw God's faithfulness the most.


