- 2) Live by the Holy Spirit's Empowerment
  - a. Regularly acknowledge and practice His on-going presence.
  - b. Avoid grieving the Holy Spirit through on-going sin.
  - c. Learn more about the Holy Spirit's role and pray for His help.

## **Questions:**

- How do you understand vs. 14 when it says the harmful spirit that tormented Saul was from the Lord? How does this inform your understanding of God's sovereignty in suffering?
- 2. How do we see God's sovereign hand in this passage? Why is it important to be reminded of God's activity even when it's "behind the scenes"? Is there anything in your life that needs to be reminded of God's sovereign activity right now?
- 3. When you think about the Holy Spirit what are some words, phrases, or descriptions that come to your mind immediately?
- 4. How would you describe your relationship with the Holy Spirit and why?
- 5. Allow 5-10 minutes for the members in your small group to do the following exercise on their own. Then, come back and share your answers and see if there are any themes or insight.

A few follow up questions after the exercise:

- ➤ What stuck out to you the most when you reviewed your answers? Are there any themes that emerged?
- Were you surprised by any of these things that the Holy Spirit does?
- ➤ How can these passages listed below assist you in developing your relationship with the Holy Spirit?
- ➤ Use the application points from the sermon to draw discussion on ways to cultivate a deeper relationship with the Holy Spirit.

9.	The Spirit bears witness in us that we are children of God (Rom. 8:16).
10.	The Spirit produces in us the fruit of His work and presence (Gal. 5:22-23)
11.	The Spirit distributes spiritual gifts to us( <u>1 Cor. 12:4</u> , <u>8-10</u> ; <u>Heb. 2:4</u> )
12.	The Spirit brings unity and oneness to the body (Eph. 4:3; 2:14-18).
13.	The Spirit enables us to wait (Gal. 5:5)
14.	The Spirit is our guarantee and deposit of the future resurrection (2 Cor. 1:22; 2 Cor. 5:5).
15.	The Spirit seals us unto the day of redemption (Eph. 1:13; 4:30).
16.	The Spirit brings freedom ( <u>2 Cor. 3:17</u> ).
17.	The Spirit comforts us (Acts 9:31).
18.	The Spirit brings things to our remembrance (John 14:26)
19.	The Spirit teaches us ( <u>1 Cor. 2:13</u> ; <u>John 14:26</u> ).
20.	The Spirit gives us joy (1 Thess. 1:6).
