## **SERMON APPLICATION GUIDE**

TRUST IN THE JUST JUDGE I SAMUEL 24:1-22 JANUARY 21<sup>ST</sup>, 2024

## Questions:

- 1. What would you have done if you were in David's shoes in vs. 4?
- 2. How do you discern God's will when faced with a decision to make? What is the most challenging aspect of that process?
- 3. Divide the small group into two groups. Assign one group to look at: 1 Thess. 5:18; Eph. 5:15-20; Romans 12:2; Psalm 143:10; Hebrews 13:20-21. Assign the other group to look at: 1 Thess. 4:3; James 4:15; 1 Peter 4:19; Matt. 7:21; Hebrews 10:35-39. Allow 10-15 minutes for the two groups to look at the various passages and answer this question: what are some principles that can aid us in discerning God's will? Then, have each group share and discuss.
- 4. David has received unjust mistreatment from Saul and yet entrusts himself to God as the judge (1 Sam 24:12-15). Ask anyone in the group to share an example of how they have received mistreatment for being a Christian (not for being unkind or annoying).
- 5. Take a moment and read 1 Peter 2:19-23; 3:13-17. How do these passages inform the way we are to respond to suffering for doing good? What is the most challenging aspect of doing this faithfully?
