Questions:

- 1. Saul was driven to desperation in this chapter. Share a time in your life in which you felt desperate (needing direction, clarity, unresolved problem/issue, or feeling stuck, lacking hope, etc.). How did you steward the desperation? What does it look like to faithfully use these seasons of desperation?
- 2. Have you had a moment of desiring guidance more than God? If so, share with the group and the impact that had on you spiritually.
- 3. What does it look like practically to desire God more than clarity?
- 4. Why is it so important to put our trials in the proper context/perspective? What are the dangers of failing to do so?
- 5. What does it look like to have the right perspective on the trials we face and how does vs. 15 help us?
- 6. Throughout this chapter, Saul is a picture of utter hopelessness. In contrast, Jesus is the Living Hope (1 Peter 1:3). What is the role of Jesus-grounded hope in the midst of trials, desperation, and challenging circumstances?
