IMPACT CAMPAIGN

MOTION 6:

Per the recommendation from the elders, I approve proceeding forward with construction for the expansion project in accordance with the Impact Campaign and utilize short term financing.

SHORT-TERM FINANCING

he short-term financing would help bridge the gap between the timing of when construction payments are due and the collection of pledges made from the congregation. The terms of the arrangement would include a two-year interest only period whereby the payment owed would equate to the interest charged on the outstanding amount borrowed. At the end of the two-year period, principal and interest would be due over an established amortization period. The intent would be to fully pay off the short-term financing by the end of year three as the pledges are collected. This arrangement allows us to begin the project sooner to ensure the costs of the project are contained.

NEXT STEPS

If the motion passes and short term financing is secured, then construction for the expansion project would begin this summer and would take approximately 9-12 months to complete. Construction and renovation to our current space will have an impact on our ministries. A plan will be communicated once this is solidified in coming months.
